COURSE DESCRIPTION

ELP 043 is an advanced reading course that focuses on skills and strategies for effective academic reading. Students at this level are expected to read extensively, both inside and outside the classroom, in order to improve and refine their reading skills. You will practice a number of reading strategies for reading faster and understanding vocabulary in context. Discussion and small group work will follow reading selections to help you develop critical reading and thinking skills.

OBJECTIVES

- Comprehend authentic texts meant for general and academic audiences
- Able to read from a variety of sources, including newspapers, unedited short stories and novels, academic articles and textbooks
- Read at an average of 200 wpm
- Able to infer and synthesize information from two or more sources
- Demonstrate an understanding of complex texts and be able to paraphrase and summarize them
- Interpret graphs and charts in authentic texts
- Summarize written material related to student's proposed major or area of academic interest
- Use refined dictionary skills and vocabulary deduction strategies
- Recognize author's tone, style, purpose, bias, and credibility
- Recognize figurative and euphemistic language

REQUIRED MATERIALS

Focus on Vocabulary: Mastering the Academic Word List (Longman) Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary (7th edition)

A notebook

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 70% on quizzes and tests, regular attendance, completing homework assignments, and participating in group and class discussions.

CLASS INFORMATION:

A <u>fifth</u> unexcused absence will result in a mandatory counseling session with the ELP student advisor and / or the director, and the immigration counselor. An <u>eighth</u> unexcused absence will automatically result in failure of the course and possible expulsion from the program.

NOTE: Being expelled from ELP means that the student will no longer be part of Purdue University Calumet and will need to leave the United States immediately.

Be on time for class and participate. Your success and the success of your peers in this course are influenced by your attendance and participation. You are expected to participate in class and in groups.

Do all of your work, and do it on time! You must complete all of your homework and in-class work for this course on the day it is due.
